Canberra Excursion

Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students participated in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion and was taken into account when excursion costs were generated to families.

Last week our School Student Parliament had a very special sitting. Our Federal Member of Parliament, Miss Emma McBride MP, took some time out of her busy schedule to take our students through the process of debating and passing a bill into law. 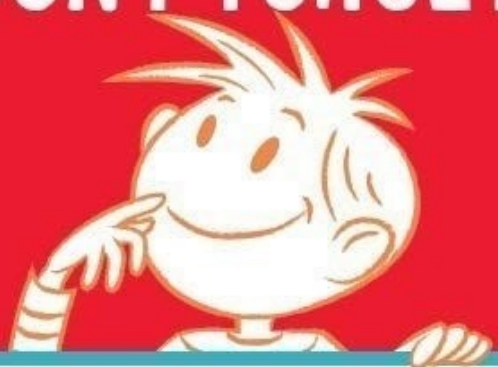

The simplest way

... to get the benefits of fibre.

Eating enough dietary fibre helps you maintain a healthy weight and digestive system.

High fibre foods include wholegrain foods such as oats and brown rice, fruit, veg, seeds, nuts and legumes such as chickpeas, beans and lentils.



Top tips to increase your fibre intake:

- Choose wholegrain, wholemeal or high fibre varieties of grain foods e.g. bread, pasta, rice, noodles and crackers.
- Fill at least half your dinner plate with vegetables.
- Reduce the amount of meat in recipes and include more vegetables and legumes.
- Have fruit, vegetables, nuts and seeds as snacks.
